# South Essex Community Council: Community Services

# What are Community Services?

SECC's Community Services are a collection of programs and services that help seniors and persons with disabilities remain independent in their own homes and fully participate in their community.

## When to consider Community Services

- You want to live at home as long as possible.
- You are recovering from an illness, injury or surgery at home and need some assistance.
- You are a caregiver in need of assistance for your loved one or need respite for yourself.

## **Eligibility**

Community Services are for persons who meet one or more of the following criteria:

- You are age 55+ OR
- You have a temporary or permanent disability or other chronic health conditions and you require supports to maintain your independence and/or mobility

# Registration Information

You do not need a referral from a doctor or other health care provider. We accept registrations directly from clients as well as caregivers looking for services for a loved one. You are welcome to register in person at our main office or over the telephone.

# Services Offered

# **Adult Day Program**

A supervised day service providing social, personal, and recreational support to clients and respite, information, and referral services for caregivers. Each client has an individualized care plan developed. Meals and snacks are provided and clients can access on-site nursing services through VON. The program runs every Monday, Wednesday & Friday and costs \$15 (half day) or \$22 (full day).



#### Foot Care Clinic

Foot care is a great way to maintain foot health and can help identify other health issues. Specially trained nurses provide foot washing, nail trimming, corn and callus reduction, padding and foot massage services. The cost is \$22.00 per visit and user fees may be covered by Veterans Affairs Canada.



### Meals on Wheels

Hot, nutritionally balanced meals are available Monday through Friday. Each meal consists of an appetizer (soup or juice), entrée and dessert. Food allergies and sensitivities are accommodated and texture modifications can be made upon request. Friendly volunteers deliver our meals providing a social contact and a check in for seniors who live alone. The meals cost \$7 and user fees may be covered by Veterans Affairs Canada.

## **Transportation Services**

Our program provides affordable door-to-door transportation including service to Windsor and across Essex County. Travel for appointments, socializing, errands, shopping or visiting friends and family. The fares and schedules are as follows. There is no charge for a self-supplied, medically required attendant or escort.

- Within Learnington, Kingsville and Wheatley (Monday Friday): \$12.00 round trip
- To Amherstburg, Essex, Lakeshore, LaSalle or Tecumseh (Check with office): \$19.00 round trip
- To Windsor (Tuesday & Thursday only): \$26.00 round trip

## Security Check and Friendly Visitation

Caring, trained volunteers provide telephone reassurance calls or in-home visits to determine individual well-being, promote social connectedness and report concerns for follow-up by SECC staff. Telephone reassurance calls are available up to seven days per week, either in the morning or afternoon. Visits can be scheduled on a day and time that is mutually convenient to the client and volunteer visitor. There is no cost for this service.

# Home Maintenance & Repair

This program provides assistance to clients needing help with chores such as snow removal, yard care, housework, small repair jobs or the occasional errand by matching them with approved service providers. Service providers must complete an application, attend an interview, submit acceptable references, supply a clean police records check and complete an orientation session. The cost is \$15-\$20 per hour depending on the type of work requested.



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
