### From the Board of Directors

I was asked by our President George Clark to do the write up for this Newsletter.

For those of you like me who are from away and not born and raised in the area this is a little bit of history of the Half Century Centre. The idea of a Centre started back in the spring of 1965 when Mrs. Fay Cochran with some of her friends discussed the possibility of creating a place for people 50 and over could get together to socialize and cultivate their interests. The idea was informally voted on and on January 20, 1966 they had a public meeting to see if the general public was on board for this idea. On May 6, 1966 the Leamington Half Century Club was incorporated. The Club was originally located at 38 Mill Street W. where there needed to do ten thousand dollars of renovation. Senior residents contributed both time and money to the cause. The families, businesses and industries along with the Municipal and Provincial Governments, the Town of Leamington as well as Mersea and Gosfield South townships. With an additional annual membership charge of Five dollars was substantial enough to reach the goal of then thousand dollars.

On January 9, 1971 the club moved to 160 Talbot Street East which was the Hillier Building and old liquor store. Money was needed to purchase the location and also do renovations. Grants from the government, donations and fund raisers carried out by the 440 members helped.

In 1973 an addition was added to the building to accommodate the fast growing facility. Money from government grants and fund raisers, donations over the years helped to pay for this needed addition.

You can read the full history of the Centre on our webpage it was written by Sonia Yaciuk a summer student in 1990 who had interviewed members of the Club.


